

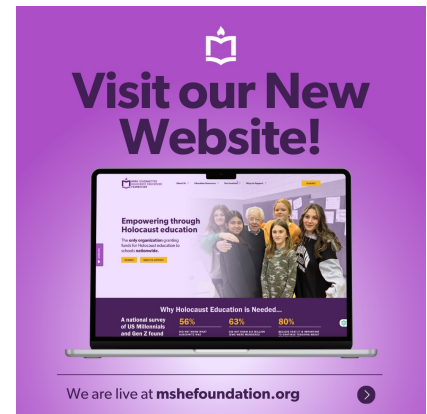

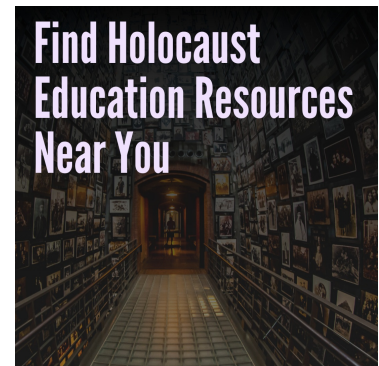

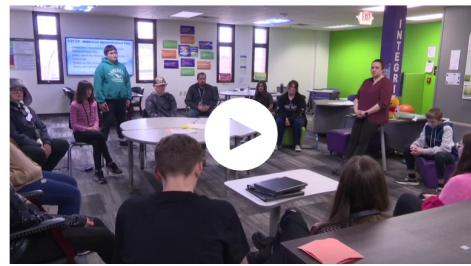


Green Bay Students Push for Holocaust Education Expansion

These students spent Holocaust Remembrance Day reflecting on their recent trip to the Illinois Holocaust Museum and Education Center, which included a speech from a 2G survivor.

They now hope to help students like them learn about the genocide. Wisconsin requires students to be taught about the Holocaust and other genocides at least once between grades 5

through 8 and again in high school. But that's where the guidelines stop. After they learn how to create an action plan at the conference, the students say their next steps will be to put the plan into action, including writing to their congressman and the governor.
