



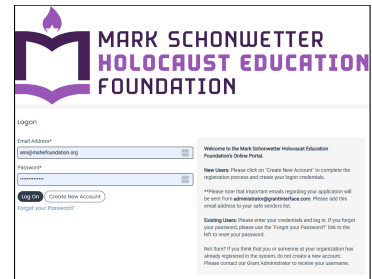

This year's webinar will feature two powerful guest speakers:

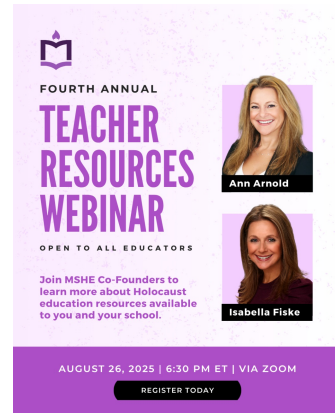

Sharing History with NJ State Trooper Recruits

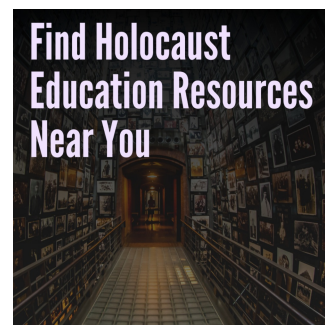
